Fulbright Prize to Gary White & Matt Damon

Washington, DC – May 16, 2024

The 22nd Fulbright Prize ceremony on May 16 celebrated the power of international collaboration and innovation in addressing global challenges. The prestigious award was given to Gary White and Matt Damon, the visionary co-founders of Water.org and WaterEquity, for their groundbreaking work in improving access to safe water and sanitation worldwide. The ceremony featured musical performances, distinguished guests, and speeches that emphasized the fundamental importance of water as a cornerstone of peace and international understanding.

The evening opened with welcoming remarks that set the stage for a celebration of international cooperation. Speakers highlighted the central role of water in sustaining civilizations and underscored the urgent need for innovative and sustainable approaches to water management. The program not only honored the laureates' extraordinary achievements but also served as a call to action for continued global collaboration in addressing the ongoing water crisis.

The ceremony recognized the extensive global support for the Fulbright Program, with representatives from the U.S. government and diplomats from around the world in attendance. This broad endorsement underscored the program's impact and its crucial role in promoting international peace through education and mutual understanding.

A highlight of the evening was the introduction of Gary White and Matt Damon, presented by Lynn Taliento, a board member at Water.org and senior advisor at McKinsey and Company. Taliento shared personal stories of her encounters with White, highlighting his innovative and tenacious approach to tackling water scarcity. She detailed how the WaterCredit initiative, pioneered by White, has enabled millions of individuals in developing regions to gain sustainable access to clean water through microloans.

NPR journalist and Fulbrighter Melissa Block then moderated a discussion with White and Damon in a deep dive into the origins and impacts of their work. Block's probing

Damon shared compelling narratives from his travels, emphasizing the transformative impact of providing clean water on the lives and futures of young people, particularly girls.

Gary White elaborated on the technical and financial innovations that have characterized Water.org's approach, explaining how integrating financial solutions with traditional water access initiatives has led to sustainable community development. He highlighted the pivotal role of local women in these projects, portraying them as essential agents of change and development.

The ceremony was not just a celebration of achievements but also a powerful reminder of the ongoing challenges in global water scarcity. Speakers throughout the evening called for continued support and involvement from the international community to expand the reach and effectiveness of these life-changing water projects.

As the evening concluded, the atmosphere was one of hope and determination. The Fulbright Prize ceremony was a profound affirmation of the power of partnership and innovation in solving some of the world's most pressing issues. It was a night filled with inspiration, celebration, and a renewed commitment to the global pursuit of peace and understanding through the essential resource of water.

The event was a poignant reminder of the continuous need for global cooperation and innovative solutions in the quest for universal access to clean water. Gary White and Matt Damon's work through Water.org and WaterEquity exemplifies the impact of combining philanthropy, entrepreneurship, and advocacy to address critical global issues. Their efforts not only provide immediate benefits in terms of health and sanitation but also empower communities to break cycles of poverty and initiate sustainable development.



Advocacy



Since 1946, the Fulbright Program, founded by Senator J. William Fulbright, has stood as a beacon of educational and cultural exchange, fostering international understanding and academic collaboration across 165 nations. As America’s flagship program for promoting global mutual understanding, the Fulbright Program empowers people to tackle pressing global challenges and create cultural exchanges that celebrate diversity and heritage. Fulbright scholars are at the forefront of shaping a more interconnected world.

Advocacy for the Fulbright Program plays a pivotal role in sustaining its impact and ensuring its continued success. Funded primarily through Congressional appropriations by the U.S. Department of State’s Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA), advocacy efforts are instrumental in demonstrating the program’s value and securing essential funding to expand its initiatives.

In Spring 2024, nearly 200 passionate alumni conveyed their interest and commitment to advocating for the Fulbright Program. Organized by both the Association’s national office and local chapters, advocates engaged in productive meetings with 36 Senate offices and 24 House offices. These meetings highlighted the significant benefits of the Fulbright Program and advocating for increased funding.

The Fulbright Program has faced challenges, including a 28.5% decrease in relative funding since 2010, despite a \$12.5 million increase in FY23. This underfunding has constrained the program’s ability to maximize its impact, making ongoing advocacy efforts crucial.

The Fulbright Program is also funded by an additional average total of \$100 million from partner countries, including the 49 Fulbright Commissions. Acknowledging the program’s global reach and collaborative partnerships, the Fulbright Association invited ambassadors from all 49 commission countries to our Fulbright Prize for International

Understanding. In attendance, we hosted embassy representatives from 31 countries; 17 Ambassadors, 13 Diplomatic Corps Members, and the Fulbright Commission Director of Finland. We were also delighted to be joined by Congressman John Sarbanes (MD), Congressman John Garmamendi (CA), and Congressman Mark Takano (CA). The event underscored the program’s role in diplomacy and international cooperation, and we are thankful and delighted by their attendance.

John Bader, former Executive Director of the Fulbright Association, emphasized the importance of alumni engagement in advocacy: “We continue to explore innovative ways to involve our alumni, recognizing their indispensable role in shaping the Fulbright Program’s future. I extend my gratitude to all who volunteered, encouraging continued participation in our advocacy efforts.”

Fulbright Association 47th Annual Conference

Washington, DC

October 25-26, 2024

The 47th Annual Fulbright Association Conference, known as FACON24, took place from October 25-26, 2024, gathering a remarkable group of scholars, leaders, and advocates in Washington, DC. This year's theme, "The World at a Crossroads", emphasized the importance of thoughtful dialogue and cross-cultural collaboration in today's world. Here's a recap of the event's most memorable sessions and insights:

The World at a Crossroads

Opening Remarks: Setting the Stage for Impactful Connections

FACON24 kicked off with a warm welcome from Dr. Robert Gervasi, Chair of the Fulbright Association Board of Directors. In his opening address, Dr. Gervasi encouraged attendees to embrace the conference as a forum for sharing ideas and finding solutions to some of the world's most pressing challenges, particularly at a time of significant political and social shifts. This theme set the tone for two days filled with interactive sessions, dedicated to promoting Fulbright's mission of fostering global understanding and engagement.

Selma Jeanne Cohen Dance Lecture: Social Dance as a Mental Health Tool

One of the standout sessions at FACON24 was the Selma Jeanne Cohen Dance Lecture, presented by Brennan Delattre, a doctoral student in psychiatry at the University of Oxford. Delattre shared her fascinating research on the mental health benefits of social dance, including capoeira and salsa. In her lecture, titled "Movement for Mental Health: The Power of Social Dance", she examined how social dance can foster empathy, reduce anxiety, and promote prosocial behaviors by encouraging nonverbal communication and synchrony. Delattre explained that dancing in pairs or groups encourages a "call and response" dynamic that helps participants feel more connected and supported.

In a powerful moment, Delattre invited attendees to participate in an interactive dance demonstration, showing firsthand how physical movement can be a healing tool that bridges individual and social factors in mental health. Her work, developed in part through her Fulbright research in Brazil, suggests that social dance could be a scalable, community-based intervention for individuals facing depression and social isolation. Delattre's findings aligned with Fulbright's goals of cultural exchange and inclusivity, making her session a highlight of the conference.





Keynote Speaker: Gallup Chairman Jim Clifton

**Keynote with Gallup Chairman Jim Clifton:
A Global Perspective on Well-Being**

Gallup Chairman Jim Clifton delivered an insightful closing keynote, providing a broad look at the well-being of individuals around the world through the lens of Gallup's World Poll. Clifton discussed Gallup's mission to record not only economic indicators but also the "human experience" by surveying over 160 countries on feelings of purpose, trust in government, and overall life satisfaction. He compared this "human data" to the global metrics collected by institutions like Bloomberg, emphasizing its value in understanding the global population's emotional and psychological state.

Clifton also shared stories about Gallup's founding by Dr. George Gallup, whose passion for understanding public opinion laid the foundation for Clifton's own mission. Dr. Gallup's innovative approach, inspired by agricultural sampling techniques, sparked a new era in data collection that now allows Gallup to gather insights on everything from local economies to the universal pursuit of a meaningful life. Clifton emphasized the profound role of purposeful work as a component of well-being, describing it as the modern-day "American Dream" across diverse global cultures.

Interactive Sessions and Engaging Roundtables

FACON24's unique format included various interactive roundtable discussions, poster sessions, and networking opportunities. Topics spanned from "Cultural Sensitivity in Social Media" to "Revitalizing Language Learning for International Relations," allowing Fulbrighters to connect deeply on topics relevant to today's world. Emphasis was placed on small group engagement rather than traditional presentations, fostering direct exchanges between attendees.

Recognizing Partnerships and Supporting Alumni

FACON24 paid tribute to the Peace Corps and Florida International University, whose support has been integral to Fulbright's continued success. These partnerships and the conference's robust exhibitor hall allowed attendees to discover resources, network with partner organizations, and celebrate the shared mission of promoting global education and exchange. The Fulbright Store provided



conference memorabilia, offering alumni a chance to display their pride in Fulbright's mission.

Closing Reflections and Future Aspirations

As FACON24 concluded, attendees reflected on the powerful insights gained and the connections forged. Participants were encouraged to carry the energy and knowledge from the conference back to their communities, fostering Fulbright's mission globally. Plenary Panels: Insights on Global Challenges and Opportunities


Four key plenary panels tackled some of the most urgent issues of our time:

Visionaries like Tarja Stephens and Nilufar Murodova discussed methods for creating inclusive, tech-driven educational models, with M.C. Brown facilitating the discussion on making education accessible and adaptable.
- 4. Security and Diplomacy** – Concluding the conference, this panel discussed the challenges and strategies of maintaining security and diplomacy in a changing world. Experts including John Weaver, Aiden Warren, and AMB Thomas Pickering, led by Marguerite Rivard Benson, offered valuable perspectives on global cooperation and peacebuilding.

Concurrent Sessions: Diverse Perspectives and Innovative Solutions

Throughout the two-day event, numerous concurrent sessions offered participants the chance to dive deeper into specific topics. Highlights included:

- 1. Global Networks and Citizen Diplomacy** – Sessions like “Broaden Your Host Country Networks” and “Global Connections: Engage in Citizen Diplomacy” explored how individuals can




foster impactful, cross-border connections.

- 2. Education and Social Change** – Talks on innovative educational models, such as “Building Bridges: Empowering Unaccompanied Minors,” shared impactful strategies for supporting diverse learners in complex environments.
- 3. Technology and Security** – Sessions like “Engineering for Democracy” and “AI in Social Media” addressed the intersection of technology with public engagement and security, examining how innovation can support societal goals.
- 4. Environmental Sustainability** – The session “Climate Change and Security Risks” highlighted regional insights on ecological issues, reinforcing the call for sustainable practices.
- 5. Diversity and Inclusion in Fulbright Initiatives** – Panels like “STEM Education from an Afro-Indigenous Perspective” and “Putting on a ‘Catedra’” emphasized the need for inclusive approaches in Fulbright programs, broadening opportunities for underrepresented communities.

The “Fulbright Stories” sessions allowed participants to share their personal journeys and the impacts of their Fulbright experiences. Networking sessions and an exhibit hall provided opportunities for Fulbrighters to connect, share ideas, and form meaningful partnerships.

Travel Program

Nepal - April 2024



I had the distinct pleasure of leading two Fulbright Association travel groups to Nepal—an unforgettable experience filled with cultural exchange, service, and connection.

The first group was a trekking team that embarked on an incredible journey along the Everest trail to the lookout above Namche Bazaar. The second was a cultural tour group exploring the rich history and traditions of the Kathmandu Valley. Both groups came together to celebrate Nepali New Year at a special event hosted by the Fulbright Commission of Nepal, where the warmth and camaraderie between new ETAs, returning alumni, and the broader Fulbright community was truly inspiring.

A sari party kicked off our celebration, where participants chose fabrics, sipped chai, and had

custom saris made to wear to the New Year event. The festive atmosphere continued as we explored local markets, rode rickshaws through Thamel, and joined in traditional dances and street festivals. The cultural group also experienced special moments like a momo-making class on a rooftop overlooking the Monkey Temple and participating in the Festival of Kumari.

Meanwhile, the Everest team bonded deeply over nine days of trekking—sharing long hours on the trail, gathering in tea houses at night, and supporting one another through challenges. Together, we crossed the famous Hillary Bridge (and navigated past yaks!), visited monasteries, met local families, and even took a helicopter flight for breathtaking views of Everest. Our team mascot, Lucky the horse, joined us for part of the trek, adding to the adventure.

Service was central to both trips. Our Fulbright teams partnered with Empower Nepali Girls to distribute over 300 school uniforms to children in Bhaktapur, supported parent meetings for scholarship recipients, delivered teddy bears to children in the Everest region, and distributed birthing sheets to rural clinics across Nepal.

The heart of this experience was the connections forged—between Fulbrighters of all backgrounds, between cultures, and between generations. This trip wasn't just about travel; it was about building community, fostering understanding, and leaving a positive impact. It's a testament to the power of the Fulbright mission, and we return inspired by the friendships, shared stories, and unforgettable moments that now connect us all to the magic of Nepal.


